One Saturday, while preparing to practice for a concert, a Jubilee Ringer excitedly said, "I just love to sing". This brought to mind the importance and the powerful influence of music in our lives. The ability of the mind to remember a tune is amazing. This is why catchy musical jingles are used in commercials to make us buy products. When we hear the tune, even without the words, we immediately associate it with the product. What director would produce a movie without music? Great attention is given to create music that captures attention, sets moods and stimulates the mind to anticipate each act.

Throughout the Bible we see that music is an integral part of ministry. One such example is when the Lord gave Moses words to write in a song and teach to the children of Israel before they crossed over into the promise land. God knew that once they became comfortable in the land they would soon forget the Lord, who delivered them from their oppressors, and serve strange gods. Consequently, they would experience severe judgment. Thus, the song would remind them of their redemption and let them realize why they were forsaken by God.

Satan is also keenly aware of how music effects one's thinking and behavior.
